This research study is being done to assess the ability of a drug to improve mental function and intellectual abilities after a traumatic brain injury.

Your participation will help us to develop better treatments for people who have suffered a traumatic brain injury (head injuries).

- ◆ If you have ever had a ***traumatic brain injury of any severity, including concussions, even without loss of consciousness***, you may qualify. We are looking for people who still have problems with thinking, memory, mood or behavior following their injury.

This research study includes tests of intellectual function, a brain scan using MRI (magnetic resonance imaging), and eye movement testing. There is no charge for evaluation or drug during the study, and participants are reimbursed for their time.
